## UPDATE FROM THE IB POA BOARD

#### **OPEN BOARD POSITIONS**

Volunteers for the Board attend one board meeting each month, communicate with residents and the property manager via email, periodically meet with Club management, and occasionally work on projects. (Section 4.2 Terms of Office. Terms of the Directors shall be two years and shall be staggered as follows. The term of at least one of the Directors shall expire annually, and at each annual meeting thereafter the members shall elect the same number of directors whose terms are expiring at the time of each election. No director may serve more than two (2) full consecutive terms unless no nominations are received or until the Executive Board can find a replacement. Upon serving two full consecutive terms, a director may not run for election for a period of one (1) year.)

There are some important and fun things on the horizon: the Transfer Fee vote, re-vamping the mailbox center project, and perhaps a beautification committee for common areas.

A community needs member involvement and fresh ideas to enhance the quality of our neighborhood.

The election of Board members will take place at the annual member meeting in early December.

## **RULES & REGULATIONS**



### **SNOW REMOVAL POLICY**

Generally, during the winter months of December, January, and February, the Snow Removal Vendor will begin plowing at the Ironbridge Community streets and walking paths as soon as the snow, or is forecasted, to reach a cumulative depth of 2 inches or more, based on the 24-hour cumulative snow total.

Consideration of real-time snow accumulation will be also considered via a street camera located near 1027 River Bend Way and Garfield County snow plowing operations.

Snow will also be cleared if accumulation is less than two inches if: 1) it appears that leaving the snow will lead to ice build-up due to extended forecasted temperatures of below 30 degrees without sunshine or 2) another snow event is forecasted in the next 48 hours.

Snow plowing will typically occur in the morning before 8 a.m. unless there is a concentrated morning snowstorm, which may require plowing to best begin after that morning event. Plowing

priority will be given to the Ironbridge entryways, round-a-bout and main streets, secondary streets, and then to the walking paths including the walkways along CR 109 toward the river. Snow plowing in non-winter months (March through November) will occur if over 2" of snow has accumulated and there are extended forecasted temperatures of below 30 degrees without sunshine.

Salt, sand, and other snow de-icing chemicals will be used as the Snow Removal Vendor considers it necessary to prevent ice build-up. Specifically, such procedures will be done in areas shaded by homes and trees, the round-a-bout and steep and/or north-facing (e.g., both Ironbridge entryways) along with street drainage areas, as considered necessary.

The responsibility of snow berms created by snow plowing operations in driveways is that of the individual residents. Snow from such berms needs to be piled up on the resident's property and not pushed back onto the street. Consistent with our IPOA guidelines, vehicles should not be parked on the streets overnight as that vehicle will prevent efficient snow removal.

The IPOA can arrange for higher levels of service, however, those changes will lead to increased costs and ultimately higher monthly association fees. The goal of the Board is to balance providing a quality level of service in the most cost-effective manner.

### **EXTERIOR LIGHTBULBS**

One of the most common code enforcement violations that are reported is burned-out exterior lightbulbs. This isn't necessarily the owner's fault but is noted by the code enforcement officer so that new lightbulbs can be provided. Exterior light bulbs are no longer changed overnight by code enforcement to ensure owner privacy (not approaching the home unannounced). Management notifies you by email that a bulb is out and a replacement will be left at your door during the day. You are responsible for changing the bulb.

**Vista** is under contract after 151 days on the market, currently listed at \$1,199,500 after starting at \$1,345,000 in May.



Price Reductions: Six of the **11 homes for sale** in Ironbridge have had price reductions. This aligns with regional trends, as we often see seasonal price adjustments around this time of year to align with buyer interest.

### **Glenwood Springs Market Snapshot**

- Days on Market: 98 days (+25% YoY)
- Average List Price: \$1.3M (+30% YoY)
- Price/SqFt: \$643 (+39% YoY)


In October, **12 homes sold** in Glenwood Springs for an average price of \$841,068.


These homes stayed on the market for an average of 54 days and received 98.7% of their original asking price. 45% of homes in Carbondale and New Castle have also seen price adjustments, suggesting that sellers are strategically adjusting to current supply and demand.

## **Regional and National Trends**

The latest **Altos Research** shows that inventory growth has slowed nationwide, with many markets (including Colorado) experiencing balanced buyer and seller activity. Price reductions remain a common strategy, reflecting seasonal patterns and a balanced market.

For Ironbridge and Glenwood Springs, interest rates remain an important factor to watch. Lower rates may spark renewed activity as we move into the final quarter, but sellers should remain cautious and competitive with pricing, especially in the higher price ranges.
